PSYCHOLOGY

The Psychology major at Sampoerna University gives students the opportunity to explore the complex world of the mind and brain--how the mind and brain evolve from infancy to old age, the environmental influences that shape our behavior, and the impact of brain disorders such as autism and Alzheimer's disease. You will gain new insights in areas of cognitive science and cognitive neuroscience, including performance, sensation, perception, language, thinking, decision making, and judgment. Students benefit from SU's small-classroom environment, dual enrollment program with the University of Arizona, and the knowledge and skills to be gained through classroom discovery, undergraduate research and hands-on experiences.

Competencies to achieve:

- Basic understanding of the various disciplines in psychology as well as major theories and history of psychology
- Familiarity and experience with psychological research methods, including data collection and analysis
- Understanding of research ethics as it related to human subjects
- Gain research experience with an opportunity to conduct actual research
- Understand behavioral, cognitive, humanistic, psychodynamic and social-cultural perspectives within psychology
- Demonstrate an understanding of the APA Code of Ethics and describe relevant ethical issues within the discipline
- Recognize the proper application of descriptive and basic inferential statistical techniques for quantitative reasoning purposes
- Explain how knowledge of psychology can be used to address personal and social issues
- Recognize and understand the importance of human diversity markers and explain their relevance to the science and practice of psychology
